Meeting called to order: 7:00pm

Meeting posted: January 6, 2023

Motion (Raue/Hankes) to approve December 15th and 30th meeting minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Committee/Department Reports:

- 1) Land Use Administrator-given by Dan Prunuske spoke on enforcement actions and to have ordinance books updated as at least four have changed or been added.
- 2) Board of Appeals- Dan Prunuske none stated.
- 3) Plan Commission- Dan Prunuske none stated.
- 4) Police Department-given by Matt Edwards read list of calls from December 2022.
- 5) Road Maintenance Department-given by Jeff Fuhrman spoke on how current plow season is going, auger repair on truck, garage door failure over Christmas holiday, and sand entering the water in town hall. One full truck of trees was collected for our first Christmas tree pickup.
- 6) IT Committee- Liz Kern none stated.

Motion (Raue/Hughes) to approve committee reports. Motion carried unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Not given, Nicole Banes absent.

Unfinished Business:

- 1) Purchasing Plow, Tractor, Mower-Dave Raue looking at getting bids for mower and tractor. Plow has a number but we need to see if it's changed since originally given and plow would be given in 2025. We are beyond the 20yr mark for the current plow we are looking at replacing or trading it in.
- 2) Property on S by G-agriculture zoned lot that looks like it is currently being used as a camp. It has tents, a camper, a shed, and a shipping container. There is a mailbox there and a welfare check has been done when it was cold to make sure people were okay. Letter is being sent as it is a current zoning violation. John Kuznciewicz said three years ago the Plan Commission changed the lot to residential. Dan Prunuske will look into but doesn't believe violation changes with knowledge nothing allows permanent or semi-permanent encampment.
- 3) Stop sign on Hemlock and Pine-Jay Van Bogert speaks Rowing Meadows and Heritage Hills subdivisions are bothered by needless stop sign. States people are not stopping completely at stop sign and one resident has been standing at stop sign and yelling at people, complaining, and acting like he is taking radar at the stop sign. Jeff Fuhrman says he saw someone go through

it at 40mph when plowing. Visibility is not clear there. John Kuczniwicz stated center of intersection is Town of Beaver Dam and Town of Trenton and Town of Trenton didn't want it changed. Five residents from Town of Trenton here and will be going to Town of Trenton after this meeting. Larry Lange (Town of Trenton) to his knowledge no incident at intersection but does state frequent incidents of people going through the stop sign. Believes police complaints would stop if the sign was removed. Mel Tresow asked if stop sign gone wants speed limit reduced to 35mph and add speed limit sign off of Hwy 33 and wants Hemlock stop sign removed. Liz Kern asks residents to gather petitions for the Town of Beaver Dam and Town of Trenton. Residents aware this is timely process.

4) Police Incentive Program-not spoken on as Joe Kern and Matt Riel were not present.

Clerks Report: We have a credit at Staples for a new computer. We need to order/find who is ordering the cards for dumpster days. Liz Kern will take on this project and asks that contact info be given to her for the mobile homes and to see if our website can have a payment option added.

Correspondence: Raue voicemails being full at town. Dan looking at upping voicemails count in inboxes to help influx we are receiving recently.

Motion (L.Kern/Raue) to approve payment of bills. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion (Raue/Hughes) to adjourn at 8:14PM. Motion carried unanimously.
